
Restrooms – Restrooms are available on the main level by the offices and on the lower level by the elevator and by the gym.

This Journey Group explores Dr. Elnes latest book, Gifts of the Dark Wood. Learn more about how we meet God in the depth of our struggles.



Pilgrim Choir is for children in the third through sixth grades. Rehearsals are on Wednesday evenings 5:15-6:00 PM. This group sings monthly in worship.

Covenant Choir

Covenant Choir is for middle school youth in grades 7 and 8. They rehearse on Wednesday evenings from 6:15-7:00 PM before Confirmation in the Junior Choir Room. This group sings monthly in worship.

Faith Singers

Faith Singers is a choir for grades 9-12 and regularly rehearses each Sunday from 4:45-6:00 PM. This choir sings most weeks during the school year for one of our worship services.

Chancel Choir

Chancel Choir is a "traditional" church choir for post-high school youth and adults. This choir sings each week for one of the worship services. Regular rehearsals are on Wednesdays from 6:25-7:55 PM.

Spirit of Grace

Spirit of Grace is a group of adults of all ages that explores contemporary church music. This group rehearses on Wednesdays from 8:05-9:05 p.m. Spirit of Grace generally sings once or twice each month, alternating between the first and second services.



TWO DAYS OF WORKSHOPS

On May 12, the Relocation Committees and Building Sub-Committee Chairmen met with our architectural design team, Alley Poyner Macchietto and HGA, to discuss the final Schematic Design phase of our building.

A Sustainability Update was the second component of the Workshop agenda. Because Countryside aspires to build with great sensitivity for our environment, our sustainability decisions require careful study and decision making. Every information session adds valuable knowledge to our committees.

On May 13, the Tri-Faith Board, made up of representatives of the three faith communities, met with the architectural firm, HGA, to launch an updated Master Plan for the Tri-Faith Campus. A survey was distributed some days before the workshop to assist HGA in getting to know our community and tap into our dreams for the campus. The next meeting is scheduled for June 7.


