# ADVENT SEASON IS COMING

The definition of "Advent" in Dictionary.com is the arrival of a notable person, thing, or event. Some suggested synonyms are: arrival, appearance, emergence, materialization, occurrence, dawn, birth, rise, and development, all of which point to something new happening. During Advent, God is doing something new and we get to be a part of it! We wait, we watch, we listen, we pray, and we study together, learning how Jesus describes what new thing God is doing. The sermon series that begins on November 27 deals with the "I Am" (Ego Eimi) statements of Jesus in the Gospel of John. From each of these statements, we will gain a new perspective on the new things God is up to by sending Jesus into the world yet again.

We also invite you to take some time to pray and reflect with the UCC Advent Devotional "Wolves and Lambs" to gain some perspective on how we

may live out God's mission for us in this world. This devotional provides daily opportunity during Advent for intentional reflection and prayer on Isaiah 11:6-9. The devotional will be available in Foyer for \$4 and is also on Kindle.

These verses challenge us to imagine a world where lambs and wolves can lie down together, not because there is no tension in their being together, but rather to help us identify the blessings that might emerge from that tension. We have exciting news about stewardship! The way you're used to thinking about stewardship is changing. The new vision is based on using Giving Made Simple (GMS). GMS is the automated payment of your stewardship support, in whatever interval you want. 

Center for Faith Studies Fall 2016 Lectures: Who Do You Say That I Am? Conversations With the Soul

Thursday, November 10 at 7 PM - Gary Ferguson, The Carry Home: Lessons from America's Wilderness



Gary is the author of 22 books on science and nature, including his instrumental role in documenting the reintroduction of wolves to Yellowstone. His newest book, The Carry Home is a moving celebration of the outdoor life shared between Ferguson and his wife Jane, who died tragically in a canoeing accident in northern Ontario in 2005, and a chronicle of the mending, uplifting power of nature. Confronting his unthinkable loss, Ferguson set out to fulfill Jane's final wish: the scattering of her ashes in five remote, wild locations they loved and shared. The act of the carry home allows Ferguson the opportunity to ruminate on their life together as well as to explore deeply the impactful presence of nature in all of our

lives. Theirs was a love borne of wild places, and The Carry Home offers a powerful glimpse into how the natural world can be a critical prompt for moving through cycles of immeasurable grief, how bereavement can turn to wonder, and how one man rediscovered himself in the process of saying goodbye.

Times Review: "The real take-away passages involve Ferguson revisiting earlier research into storytelling and specifically native American myth to find that the stories we need to make sense of life usually have three elements: beauty, mystery and community. The beauty is here on every page; his language is gorgeous, giving us an "American West, a region where everything kneels at the river" and "the kind of sadness that lies along the far edges of every love."


### **IRELAND 2017**





### **Sunday School**



#### **Kids Music**

Joyful Noise (Pre-K), Carol Choir (K-3) and Pilgrim Choir (4-6) are designed to allow younger musicians to develop their new music skills for worship. Rehearsals for the Carol and Pilgrim Choirs are on Wednesday evenings 5:15-6:00 PM. Joyful Noise rehearses from 5:15-5:30 PM. Each group sings monthly in worship.

### **Covenant Choir**

Covenant Choir is for youth in grades 7 and 8. They rehearse on Wednesday evenings 6:15-7:00 PM before Confirmation Class in the Junior Choir Room. The choir sings monthly in worship.

### **Faith Singers**

Faith Singers, for high school students, rehearses each Sunday from 4:45-6:00 PM. The choir sings most weeks during the school year.

### **Spirit of Grace**

Spirit of Grace choir, also for adults, explores a variety of contemporary choral literature and sings once or twice per month. Rehearsals are Wednesdays, 6:20-7:20 PM.

### **Chancel Choir**

The adult Chancel Choir sings selections from the Classical Choral Repertoire weekly in worship. Regular rehearsals are Wednesdays, 7:30-8:45 PM.

You've seen these pages before, right? Great big sheets of parchment with lines of huge, hand-written chant text and neumes, pronounced "nyooms". You see these pages framed in music studios and on walls in peoples' homes. Some are very simple, written in only black and red ink. Others feature ornate calligraphy and beautifully illustrated incipits (first letters) like the one here.

No matter the level of artistry, I've always been fascinated by these pages and where they came from. You see, before Guttenberg and his printing press, music was hand copied into huge tomes that sometimes required multiple people to carry (especially little choir boys!) and many people would gather around a single volume and sing together. There was no personal space among monks!

came back to me repeatedly as I reflected on our current sermon series, "I Call You Friends". The Worship Planning team has worked hard to enhance the message of friendship. We selected Rublev's painting "The Trinity" to guide our Visual Arts, media, and communications. We placed comfortable, inviting seating in the chancel to reflect Rublev's invitation to the table in real life. We invited people into that space to discuss the hard topics that friends tackle every day.

Our music for the series is meant to do the same – to throw back to the good ole days of sitting around a single choir book, blending voices with no personal space! As you listen to our choral blessings at the nine o'clock service, sing along with "Benediction" at eleven, and enjoy the many small group music offerings. I hope you will look for ways to add music to your own small group activities. Maybe host a few guitar playing friends around your fire-pit some evening or sing a song around the Thanksgiving table? Music lends an extra dose of warmth and we are blessed when we add it to the friendship mix.


### **Board of Deacons**
