
Center for Faith Studies Fall 2016 Lectures: Who Do You Say That I Am? Conversations With the Soul

Thursday, October 6 at 7 PM- Orlando Rodriguez, In Our Son's Name: 15 Years After 9/11

Phyllis and Orlando Rodríguez lost their son, Greg, in the attacks on the World Trade Center on September 11, 2001. Their journey afterward is featured in a documentary airing on PBS in September as America marks the 15 year anniversary. Faced with grief, anger and questions of where God was, the bereaved parents choose reconciliation and nonviolence over vengeance on a transformative journey that both confirms and challenges their convictions. Eventually the path led them to publicly oppose the death penalty of avowed 9/11 conspirator Zacarias Moussaoui and also to befriend his mother. The film also features Talat Hamdani, whose heroic son, Mohammad Salman, perished rescuing others yet he was wrongly deemed a suspect due to his Muslim faith. The couple speaks out against anti-Muslim actions and has found peace in working with prison inmates. Along the way, they have found better understanding of each other and



Thursday, November 10 at 7 PM - Gary Ferguson, The Carry Home: Lessons from America's Wilderness



Gary is the author of 22 books on science and nature, including his instrumental role in documenting the reintroduction of wolves to Yellowstone. His newest book, The Carry Home, is a moving celebration of the outdoor life shared between Ferguson and his wife Jane, who died tragically in a canoeing accident in northern Ontario in 2005, and a chronicle of the mending, uplifting power of nature. Confronting his unthinkable loss, Ferguson set out to fulfill Jane's final wish: the scattering of her ashes in five remote, wild locations they loved and shared. The act of the carry home allows Ferguson the opportunity to ruminate on their life together as well as to explore deeply the impactful

presence of nature in all of our lives. Theirs was a love borne of wild places, and The Carry Home offers a powerful glimpse into how the natural world can be a critical prompt for moving through cycles of immeasurable grief, how bereavement can turn to wonder, and how one man rediscovered himself in the process of saying goodbye.

RELIGION AND SUSTAINABILITY

Taught by David Holtzlaw, Ph.D., Countryside member and adjunct professor at UNL who specializes in sustainable engineering and energy. This will be an interactive class to help participants gain a high school level understanding of the three global ecosystems: land, water and atmosphere and how our human made resources – energy, materials, transportation – effect these ecosystems. New Sermon Series-Gifts of the Indigo Tent

Our current worship series is Gifts of the Indigo Tent. This series will last from September 11th through the end of Advent at Christmas. It will be divided into three smaller series. First, we begin with EAARTH which began September 11 with our Circle of Peace service and runs through October 16. This series begins with a funeral for a 46 year-old mother (who is an analogy to our 4.6 billion-year-old Earth) followed by several services that move us through the classic stages of grief (Denial, Anger, Bargaining, Depression, Acceptance).

Then October 22 through November 27, we'll shift gears to a "happier" theme – friendship. Eric will propose a "theology of friendship for wilderness wanderers" that moves us forward as a community of the faithful in a time of intense challenge. In this series, we will re-envision Christian faith and practice from the ground up based on a foundation of our friendship with God, Neighbor, Earth and Self.

Finally, December 4 through December 25, we will provide some preliminary answers to Jesus's question, "Who do you say I am?" by exploring how the early Christian community answered the question in the Gospel of John, through Jesus's famous "I am" (ego eimi) statements. What we will find is that the same beauty and majesty that inspired the early Christians and shifted the course of the world a step closer to the Promised Land, is still very much alive and may serve as a resource for our journey today.

There will be resources for your small groups. Eric will be writing a commentary on each week's message. This won't be a transcript of the sermon. Rather, it will be a 1,200ish word reflection that speaks to the heart of the week's message. He's calling it "Fire Starters." Video of the full sermon will be available online. We will also be providing discussion questions each week to help start the conversation.



Vacation Bible School is a short summer camp designed to immerse our students in a community experience of scripture stories and activities.

Wednesday Night Programming - Holy Moly

Wednesday Night Programming - Core 56

On Wednesday nights, our 5th and 6th grade group delves into scripture study of Jesus's ministry and work. We also fellowship at lockins, movie nights, and group suppers.

Sunday School

Our students and teachers engage with scripture and activities with our in-house curriculum through Countryside's theology and faith practices. Sunday School is offered for students pre-K through 6th grade.




