New Worship Series-Reclaiming Eden

We invite our Journey Groups to follow along with our new master worship series, Reclaiming Eden. The first worship segment within this series is Imago Dei and it begins January 8 and takes us through February 19.

You can't understand much about Jesus or the Church that bears his name unless you understand Genesis and Exodus - the foundational books of the Jewish and early Christian communities. In this series, we'll explore key stories in Genesis, then move to key stories from Exodus which have affected Christianity strongly since the beginning and still do today. We begin by turning to Genesis 3 and the story of "the fall of Adam and Eve," which is the basis for the Christian doctrine of Original Sin (a doctrine not shared by Jews or Muslims, by the way, even though they consider the same story to be foundational). Join us as we study each of the seven deadly sins and the seven lively virtues that balance them.

If you do not presently participate in a journey group and would like to learn more about them, please contact Rev. Chris Alexander at Chrisa@countrysideucc.org. She will get you some information and let you know how you might join a group that is already meeting, or how you might start your own group.

We provide each group with resources for discussion each week including group discussion questions, a link to the video of the week's sermon and an attachment with Pastor Eric's weekly commentary on the week's message or a transcript of the sermon. You are never on this journey alone.

Countryside has one of the most celebrated music and arts ministries in Omaha. We have excellent opportunities for expressing our faith through the creative arts. Our halls are bustling with activity on weekdays and Sundays as everyone brings their unique creative talents to worship services.

Kids Music

Joyful Noise (Pre-K), Carol Choir (K-3) and Pilgrim Choir (4-6) are designed to allow younger musicians to develop their new music skills for worship. Rehearsals for the Carol and Pilgrim Choirs are on Wednesday evenings 5:15-6:00 PM. Joyful Noise rehearses from 5:15-5:30 PM. Each group sings monthly in worship.

Covenant Choir

Covenant Choir is for youth in grades 7 and 8. They rehearse on Wednesday evenings 6:15-7:00 PM before Confirmation Class in the Junior Choir Room. The choir sings monthly in worship.

Faith Singers

Faith Singers, for high school students, rehearses each Sunday from 4:45-6:00 PM. The choir sings most weeks during the school year.

Spirit of Grace

Spirit of Grace choir for adults explores a variety of contemporary choral literature and sings once or twice per month. Rehearsals are Wednesdays, 6:20-7:20 PM.

This honor is symbolic of all of the successes the four school age children have achieved since enrolling in Omaha Public Schools. They are acclimating well and loving their involvement in school. The two high school students are in an extraordinary ELL program where they have access to two Arabic speaking teachers. Their elementary aged son is enjoying school and is receiving significant support from a caring classroom staff.

The care team reports their experience with the al Ghates family has been very positive, with challenges in providing transportation and medical care among the greatest concerns. Khalied is still seeking employment and would like to work as a driver. He attends ESL classes faithfully. Kholud is an excellent cook and all of us have enjoyed meals with the family. She is at home with the two little girls.

RELOCATION UPDATE

RELOCATION CAMPAIGN FEBRUARY UPDATE

The Countryside Relocation Committee (CRC) as well as its various sub-committees have been very busy making decisions regarding our new church building.

PETERSON COVER has been chosen as the preferred building enclosure product (exterior) to complement the metal panels at the sanctuary and wood accents at the canopy. This "cover" material is made from fired clay similar to brick or terra cotta but is "hung" on the building in an overlapping shingle-like installation versus staking using mortar and ties as is the case with traditional bricks. This method provides unique architectural impact and a near maintenance free building enclosure.

AIRFLOOR is an innovative alternative HVAC system installation that eliminates ductwork and drop ceilings. It provides radiant and forced-air heating/cooling through a network of steel forms and registers embedded in the concrete floor. It has been decided to

install the AIRFLOOR system in the sanctuary space to improve comfort, reduce air noise, and improve energy efficiency. Worshippers will benefit from the evenly conditioned environment, also enjoying warm floors in winter and cool ones in the summer. This system was installed at Temple Israel with good results.

The HGA/APM Design team will continue with the design development documents which will vet out the various details including ceiling/floor/wall finishes, cabinet detailing, mechanical and electrical system design, and other unique building features. It is anticipated that this phase of design will be completed in February and costs will be reviewed and validated again at that time.

More decisions will be made in the upcoming months and, as always, we will keep the congregation updated through the C-10 and monthly newsletters.

The two older girls are enjoying school. Omaha Public Schools has the tools and skills necessary to accommodate the many refugees in the OPS system.

The family just experienced a setback as Shaher lost his job. The language barrier might have been a bigger challenge than we originally thought, so he will go to ESL classes with Sahar until he finds another job. The CCC team along with the Employment First agency (part of Lutheran Family Services) is prioritizing finding him a new full-time job that provides benefits. He was a mechanic in Syria.

Each visit with the family is met with their sincere gratitude for our sponsorship and a forceful dose of their generous and genuine hospitality.
