

RELOCATION UPDATE

CONGREGATIONAL MEETING RESULTS - A RESOUNDING "YES!"

Two hundred fifty-nine members gathered in the sanctuary on Sunday. March 19. to vote upon the offer from Coram Deo Church Community to purchase the building and property of our present home.

The meeting was called to order by Moderator, Bruce Blanchard. The process, timeline and particulars of the sale were then presented by Tim Kerrigan, Relocation Committee and Trustee Committee member. Following that explanation, the members had the opportunity to ask questions pertaining to the sale.

A motion to accept the offer to purchase our Property was made by Church Treasurer, Phil Johnson. Discussion of the motion followed. The members were requested to accept the offer and voting commenced. When the ballots were collected and counted ,the motion to sell received 241 Yes votes and 16 No votes. The motion was approved by 93% of voting members present.

Purchase Agreement Highlights:

- Purchase Price \$4.2 Million
- Deposits Estimated \$550,000
- Net Proceeds \$4,049,422

Agreement Contingencies:

- Congregational Approval (Accomplished)
- Commence new church construction by August 15, 2017

Personal Property Matters:

- Pews and padded chairs stay
- Limited personal property stays
- Treasures and contents move

Real Estate Closing:

- Within 30 days of relocating to new church.
- We are targeting a December, 2018 move to the new building but have a grace period of additional months in case of unforeseen delays.

- Buyer has the "right of specific performance," the expectation that we execute the contract according to terms agreed upon.
- Countryside's remedy is retention of the deposit.

This vote was a watershed moment in the history of Countryside. The Countryside Relocation Committees (CRC and CRAC) will confidently move forward knowing that our church family moves in step with us.
