GROUNDBREAKING JUNE 5,2017

Omaha - home of the College World Series, the Henry Doorly Zoo, the Old Market, the Oracle of Omaha and now the site of the Tri-Faith Initiative. The Tri-Faith Commons, on the southeast corner of 132nd and Pacific Streets, is truly unique. Nowhere else in the world have the three major Abrahamic faiths intentionally built individual houses of worship on the same tract of land with the intent to promote dialogue, transcend differences, foster acceptance, and build bridges of respect and trust while practicing their own individual faiths.

In the aftermath of 9-11, members of Temple Israel walked to a neighboring mosque to show their support of their neighbors. That event led to a conversation that eventually resulted in the Tri-Faith Initiative. In 2014, Countryside Community Church was invited to become the Christian church in this endeavor and in April of 2015 Countryside members voted to relocate

our church to join with our Jewish and Muslim friends in promoting peace and understanding in our conflicted world.

The Tri-Faith Initiative holds much promise in setting an example of how people of different faiths cannot just coexist but grow and prosper. It is with this promise in mind that we are pleased to announce the date of our groundbreaking of our new home at 13130 Faith Plaza.

On Monday, June 5, we will gather and break ground for our new church. The Rev. Dr. John C. Dorhauer, UCC National President, will be our guest speaker and we are delighted to have him with us. At 5:00 p.m. we can gather for socializing and light refreshments and at 5:30 p.m. the groundbreaking program will begin.

Journey Groups






