TRI-FAITH PICNIC

AMI (American Muslim Institute) will host all three faiths for the Annual Tri-Faith Picnic on Sunday, August 20, from 12:30-3:00 PM in their new building at 13140 Faith Plaza.

There will be games and activities for all ages as well as plenty of food and beverages. This is a wonderful opportunity to spend time with our new neighbors and get to know each other better. As modesty is an important part of the Muslim faith, we ask that attendees do not wear short skirts/shorts, tank tops/muscle shirts or seethrough/revealing clothing. Shuttles will be available from Temple Israel.

Grilled Halal beef burgers, Kosher hot dogs, and cold drinks and water will be provided. We are asking each family to bring a potluck dish to share with everyone (plan a dish to serve 20 people). Keeping Jewish and Muslim food practices in

mind, we ask that you please stay away from pork (not even bacon in the salads, please!), gelatin or shellfish. If you do use any of these, please list the ingredients of your recipe on your dish so our volunteers can make signs for our guests.

As we gather with our neighbors, perhaps ask them about their dietary customs and how they follow them in their faith traditions. It will be a great way to learn from one another, and show our neighbors that who they are matters to us.

AGAPE


The AGAPE group has been a ministry of love and support for many decades, providing a warm and loving fellowship opportunity following memorial or funeral services.



Nursery

Childcare is available during Sunday worship for infants and toddlers ages newborn to twoyear-olds. Our nursery volunteers are trained and have passed background checks.


