

Edna Heumann, 100, died on March 1., and her funeral was officiated by Rev. Dr. Chris Alexander at Heafey on March 7.



PRAYER CHAIN: LIFTING THE BASKET

A visual you may find helpful as you pray:

Imagine that right beside you is a large, oval, sturdy basket with handles. Silently or quietly, you express your worries and burdens. Imagine gently placing each one inside this strong basket, without fussing over how untidy it all looks. Then, lift. Is it heavy? It might be so very heavy that you can only lift it a couple of inches. Imagine your arms straining under the burdensome basket of worry and cares; you realize how tired you are. At that moment you release the handles, trusting God to take the basket off your hands and finish lifting. You can't know what will be done with your burdens, yet you do know that they were just too much for you - but not too much for Creator Lord. You may rest knowing that you've done all that one can do, and you offer prayers of thanksgiving that you have such a Partner as this. The next day, the basket is returned to you. You notice that it's been emptied, and is lying at your feet, waiting to be filled.

As you may know, Countryside has a very active prayer chain; Jan Brown sends out the requests once or twice a week via an email to about 110 people who faithfully hold each request in loving prayer. You may join in this effort by asking Jan to include your email address; in addition, you may request prayers by directly contacting the pastors or Jan, or via our church's website countrysideucc.org under "Caring Together: Pastoral Care."

DOOR POLICY

Countryside created a Safety and Security Committee last year to provide a safe environment for all to worship and to conduct church business at Countryside's current location and at the Tri-Faith Commons. The committee has been drafting policies and procedures and is moving towards implementation after consultation and input from security experts

Two actions are being shared this month with implementation in May: (1) Rollout of a new door access policy and (2) the formation of a Sunday morning security team.

Door Access Policy - Over the years, Countryside has had many renovations and additions. With these changes, the church finds itself with many exterior doors with multiple access points into the church. The new door access policy intends to be sensitive to the needs of our people but also to discourage intruders who do not have a valid reason to be in our building. With this rollout, Countryside will be moving towards one primary entrance, the Main Office Entry door, throughout the week except Sundays.

- Weekday business hours (8-4 PM) All doors will be locked with access to the church granted at the main office entry doors. The upper NW gym doors and lower SW Gym will use a door buzzer to request entrance.
- Weekday evenings and Saturdays Access to church will be through the main office doors which will be open only 20 minutes before and after the start of meetings and events. The lower SW gym doors will only have access to the gym.
- Sunday Worship Services Access will be through the Sanctuary Doors, the upper NW gym doors and lower SW Gym doors.
- The East lower courtyard doors will only be used on Sunday nights for COYO and Arts Affirmation.

These changes will be effective Monday April 30. To read the full door access policy please visit countrysideucc.org/doors.

Books Bible and Beyond


Wednesday at Noon in the Chapel

- TheoloTea: Thursday mornings, 9:00-10:15 AM in The Commons (tea provided)



CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING FOR APRIL WORSHIP SERVICES



Our children remain in the Sanctuary for the Worship service! Books and worship bags are available to borrow from a cart in the Foyer.

April 8 - Sunday School

Jesus Meets Us Where We Are: Easter Stories of Thomas and Mary Magdalene. Because Jesus knew the hearts of his disciples he was able to inspire them to carry on his mission in the most effective way. Understanding how deeply Jesus knew them and loved them enabled them to take his message of love out into the world.

April 15 - Children's Church

Children will proceed together to the Chapel for child-centered worship.

April 22 - Sunday School

Communion Traditions. On the last Thursday of Jesus's life, he gathered his friends around a Passover table and instructed them with the words "take and eat" and "do this in remembrance of me." We honor that meal today in all its many forms.

April 29 - Children's Church

Children will proceed together to the Chapel for child-centered worship.

CORE 56 AND HOLY MOLY

Core 56 groups welcome all students in 5th and 6th grades to meet to discuss scripture stories that center primarily around the New Testament and the teachings of Jesus. Each week, we will discuss scripture stories, consider historical and cultural context, and contemplate how we can use what we have learned from them in our lives today. Please ask your Core 56 student to bring their bible—if you don't have one, just ask Rebecca! At the beginning of each class, we will spend some time in a meditative prayer sit for 10 minutes, inviting the Spirit into our time together and centering our minds and bodies. This month, our group will be discussing stories about the disciples after Jesus had died and how they developed community around their beliefs.

Holy Moly students meet in two classrooms on the lower level in groups of K-2nd graders and 3rd and 4th graders. Each week this spring, we will explore an Old Testament tale with storytelling, a short video, and an activity. In April, we will study the stories of the Road to Emmaus, Pentecost, and Saul becoming Paul.

Our final meeting for Holy Moly and Core 56 is wednesday, april 18.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We are excited to study scripture stories with our Countryside children! During the 9 AM service, our students will meet together into two classrooms: pre-K and one large group for Kindergarten through 6th grade. During the 11 AM service, our students are divided between four classrooms: Pre-K, K-1st, 2nd-4th, and 5th & 6th grades.

We leave together as a group after the Children's Moment and head to classrooms. Students remain in their classrooms until collected by a parent or guardian. This month, our students will continue working in their gratitude journals as well as studying and discovering the practices of Holy Week.

Children's Education offers programs designed to inspire, explore, and develop a solid faith foundation. Through story, discussion, and experiential activities, our students embark on a Christian path encouraged by enthusiastic study, adventurous approach to Scripture, and cultivation of a strong faith community.

Nursery

Childcare is available during Sunday worship for infants and toddlers ages newborn to twoyear-olds. Our nursery staff is trained and have passed background checks.

Family Worship

Typically held on the first Sunday of each month, Family Worship offers the opportunity to share scripture, message, and communion as a family! Children's Bibles, books, and age-appropriate activity bags are available.

Sunday School

Our students and teachers engage with scripture and activities with our in-house curriculum through Countryside's theology and faith practices. Sunday School is offered for students pre-K through 6th grade.

Children's Church

This child-centered Worship celebrates our faith stories with songs, scripture, and discussion while honoring faith practices like communion, prayer, and stewardship! It's open to children five years old through 6th grade.

Wednesday Night Programming - Holy Moly

During the school year, K through 4th grade students meet for Holy Moly! A Sparkhouse curriculum teaches Bible stories with multimedia, crafts, activities, and storytelling.

Wednesday Night Programming - Core 56

On Wednesday nights, our 5th and 6th grade group delves into scripture study of Jesus's ministry and work. We also fellowship at lockins, movie nights, and group suppers.

Vacation Bible School

Vacation Bible School is a short summer camp designed to immerse our students in a community experience of scripture stories and activities. Dates for 2018 VBS are July 9-13.

SPECIAL EASTER OFFERING - TABLE GRACE MINISTRIES

Table Grace Café affordably offers healthier meals than many quick-dine cafés, making it the feel-good lunch destination in Omaha. The menu for the Café fluctuates based on food donations from Whole Foods, farmer's markets, and others but primarily serves soup, salad, and pizza that best utilizes the food donations and serves as a simple lunch café downtown.

Table Grace Café offers a 10-Day Job Training program that teaches people "to fish." The Café utilizes its environment as basic job readiness programming. This model is based on the job programming Chef Matt Weber experienced at he Natural Gourmet Cooking School and is similar to technical colleges, but modified for people who have difficulty maintaining entry level employment or who have dropped out of the workforce for so long that they need a stepping stone into entry level jobs. The focus is on attendance, appropriate appearance, skills, workplace communication, and customer service skills.

Christian Outreach embraces opportunities that reflect appreciation, respect, and love where there was otherwise much neglect - providing funding and service opportunities that nurture lasting change in our congregation, our community, and our world.

Passover March 30 - April 6

Pesach, known as Passover in English, is a major Jewish spring festival, commemorating the Exodus from Egypt over 3,000 years ago. Today, the holiday is a celebration of freedom and family.

Yom HaShoah, also known as Holocaust Remembrance Day, April 11-12

Yom HaShoah occurs on the 27th of Nisan. Shoah, which means catastrophe or utter destruction in Hebrew, refers to the atrocities that were committed against the Jewish people during World War II. This is a memorial day for those who died in the Shoah.

Yom HaZikaron (Israeli Memorial Day) and Yom HaAtzmaut (Israeli Independence Day) April 17-19

The Israeli Knesset established the day before Yom HaAtzmaut as Yom HaZikaron, a Memorial Day for soldiers who lost their lives fighting in the War of Independence and in other subsequent battles. Yom HaAtzmaut, Israeli Independence Day, marks the establishment of the modern state of Israel in 1948. It is observed on or near the 5th of Iyar in the Hebrew calendar, which usually falls in April.
