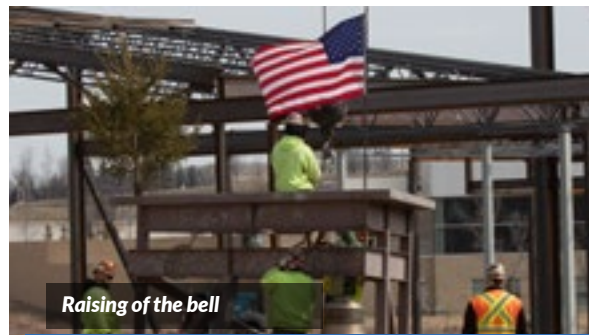

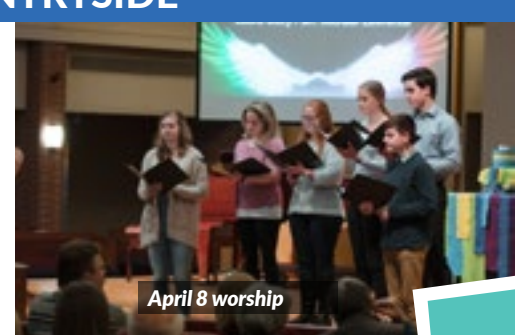

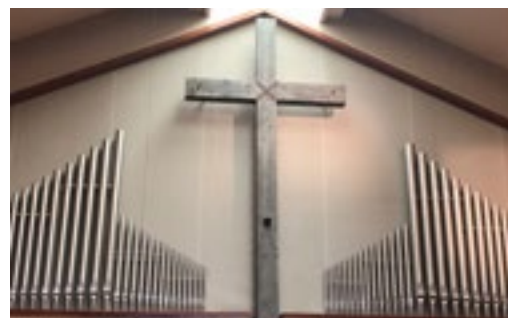
WHY OUR TREASURES MATTER

In Countryside's move to its new location, much thought and care has gone into the task of taking our most treasured possessions with us. Each piece has a story to tell and history to share. With the construction of Countryside at 87th and Pacific in 1965-66, four treasures were put in place in the church: the chancel cross, pipe organ, sanctuary windows and steeple bell. This is the story of the cross. The history of the pipe organ and windows will appear in the next newsletter. The bell's story was shared in previous publications.

The cross was designed and built to be installed in the sanctuary upon completion of the church in 1966. The lumber was sourced from Millard Lumber. After weathering outside for a time, church member Dwayne Holstein assembled the pieces. Rev. Bob Alward, Countryside's senior minister at the time, was not satisfied with the unblemished surfaces of the piece. He enlisted members John and Lea Marshall to help give the cross the look and character that we see today. There were sessions with the three of them whacking and distressing the piece with hammer, chain and other tools to achieve a rough and "rugged cross." Rev.

Alward felt such a look was appropriate to the Christian symbol that bore witness to the cruelty of the crucifixion that marked the beginnings of our faith.

In 2000, the cross was shortened to accommodate the redesign of the sanctuary. It will again be resized to fit in its own lighted niche in the new chapel. Countryside's treasures are woven into our history. They symbolize the love that past members offer to our church family: past, present and future. Our treasures help carry us from endings to new beginnings. Countryside's cross will begin its journey on Pentecost Sunday, May 20, 2018. See page 9 for more details of the move.

You may find wisdom, important life experiences, love and hope within the pages, and we'd like to mention them as fuel for your own journey. Congratulations to Rev. Donna Knutson and to Sharon Royers. We all experience difficult times in our lives; how do they transform us?

While writing *Finding God on Mayberry Street*, Rev. Donna Knutson recalled faces of Countryside friends who supported her call into ministry. The spirit and depth of the Holy Spirit sought to find form and expression through her words about people, nature, and ordinary days. This book of poems, prayers and reflections shares moments of awareness regarding what tenders our hearts toward others and their needs when we listen. Rev. Starting in May, Countryside will be moving towards one primary entrance, the Main Office Entry door, throughout the week except Sundays.

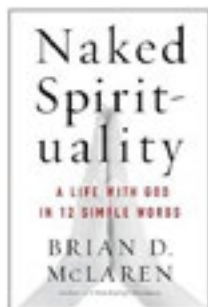
- Weekday business hours (8-4 PM) - Access into the church will be granted at the main office entry doors, the upper northwest gym doors and lower southwest gym doors by using a door buzzer to request entrance.
- Weekday evenings and Saturdays - Access to church will be through the main office doors which will be open only 15 minutes

before and after the start of meetings and events. The lower southwest gym doors will only have access to the gym.

- Sunday Worship Services - Access will be through the Sanctuary Doors, the upper northwest gym doors and lower southwest gym doors.
- The East lower courtyard doors will only be used on Sunday nights for COYO and Arts Affirmation.
- Special events and rentals will be handled on an individual basis.



CHILDREN'S PROGRAMMING FOR MAY WORSHIP SERVICES

May 6 - Family Worship

Our children remain in the Sanctuary for the worship service! Books and worship bags are available to borrow from a cart in the Foyer.

May 13 - Sunday School

We are the Hands and Feet and Eyes of Christ. We come close to God through prayer, through study of our Bible, and through examining life as Jesus lives. We also learn from the lives of others who follow God. Today we learn from a prayer written by St. Teresa of Avila.

May 20 - Children's Church

Children will proceed together to the Chapel for child-centered worship.

May 27 - Sunday School, Teacher Appreciation

Peter and Cornelius paid attention to their dreams, and were able to discern God's message of inclusive love. Their new perspective allowed non-Jews to be welcomed to this new community of Jesus' followers. No longer would dietary laws or circumcision be required, but all would be welcome in God's circle of love.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL - JULY 9 - 13

Countryside's Vacation Bible School will be held July 9 through 13 and our theme this year is Peace Lab! Our VBS students will explore scripture stories and activities to cultivate and practice peacemaking techniques and skills. VBS is offered for our students in Pre-k through 4th grade (based on the grade just finished this past 2017-2018 school year) and will run from 9 AM-Noon each day, with a little extra time on Friday so that we can share what we've done with family and friends!



WEDNESDAY NIGHT ACTIVITIES

Core 56 -Our Core 56 group will continue to meet in the summer on Wednesday nights beginning June 6. Our incoming 5th graders (those who have just completed the 4th grade) are welcome to join us during our summer sessions.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We are excited to study scripture stories with our Countryside children! During the 9 AM service, our students will meet together into two classrooms: pre-K and one large group for Kindergarten through 6th grade. During the 11 AM service, our students are divided between four classrooms: Pre-K, K-1st, 2nd-4th, and 5th & 6th grades.

We leave together as a group after the Children's Moment and head to classrooms. Students remain in their classrooms until collected by a parent or guardian. This month, our students will continue working in their gratitude journals as well as studying and discovering the practices of Holy Week.

Through story, discussion, and experiential activities, our students embark on a Christian path encouraged by enthusiastic study, adventurous approach to Scripture, and cultivation of a strong faith community.

Nursery

Childcare is available during Sunday worship for infants and toddlers ages newborn to two-year-olds. Our nursery staff is trained and have passed background checks.

Family Worship

Typically held on the first Sunday of each month, Family Worship offers the opportunity to share scripture, message, and communion as a family! Children's Bibles, books, and age-appropriate activity bags are available.

Sunday School

Our students and teachers engage with scripture and activities with our in-house curriculum through Countryside's theology and faith practices. Sunday School is offered for students pre-K through 6th grade.

Children's Church

This child-centered Worship celebrates our faith stories with songs, scripture, and discussion while honoring faith practices like communion, prayer, and stewardship! It's open to children five years old through 6th grade.

Wednesday Night Programming - Holy Moly

During the school year, K through 4th grade students meet for Holy Moly! A Sparkhouse curriculum teaches Bible stories with multimedia, crafts, activities, and storytelling.

Wednesday Night Programming - Core 56

On Wednesday nights, our 5th and 6th grade group delves into scripture study of Jesus's ministry and work. We also fellowship at lock-ins, movie nights, and group suppers.

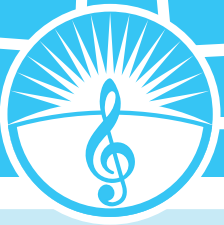
Vacation Bible School

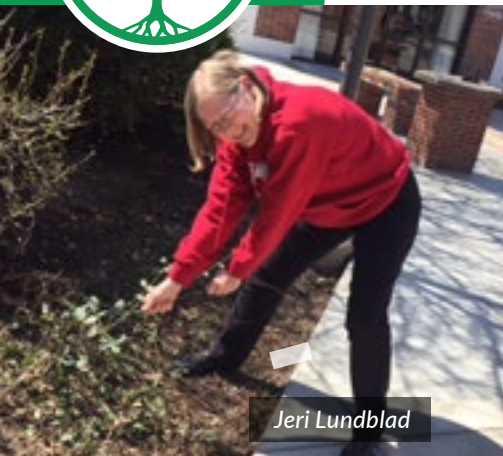

HOLIDAYS

Jewish

Shavuot May 19 - 20

Shavuot is the Hebrew word for "weeks" and refers to the Jewish festival marking the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai, which occurs seven weeks after Passover. Shavuot, like many other Jewish holidays, began as an ancient agricultural festival that marked the end of the spring barley harvest and the beginning of the summer wheat harvest. In ancient times, Shavuot was a pilgrimage festival during which Israelites brought crop offerings to the Temple in Jerusalem.

Muslim

Ramadan May 16 to June 15

Ramadan is the ninth month of the Islamic calendar, which is spent by Muslims fasting from dawn to sunset, and with extra prayers. While fasting Muslims refrain from consuming food, drinking liquids, smoking, and engaging in sexual relations. As the Islamic calendar is a lunar calendar, Ramadan begins when the first crescent of a new moon is sighted. The religious feast is celebrated during the entire month. During Ramadan the Quran was sent to the lowest heaven. The Islamic prophet Muhammad told his followers that the gates of Heaven would be open during Ramadan and the gates of Hell (Jahannam) would be closed. Fasting during Ramadan is one of the Five Pillars of Islam and the first day after Ramadan is celebrated as the Eid al-Fitr (Festival of Breaking Fast).
