
















INTERFAITH THANKSGIVING

Challenge: Why is David Wilson more likely than DeTonte Williams to get called in for an interview with exactly the same resumé? Why are sentences for the same crime longer for Blacks than Whites? Why are Amber Alerts more likely to be issued and publicized for White girls than children of color? Why are Black kids more likely to be suspended from school than White kids? Why are people of color less likely to be accepted as guests through Air B&B? Is it blatant racism or pervasive implicit bias? How can you know? Here's the challenge: take the Harvard Implicit Association Test for race, but be prepared. You may not be comfortable with the results. implicit.harvard. edu/implicit/education.html

Through story, discussion, and experiential activities, our students embark on a Christian path encouraged by enthusiastic study, adventurous approach to Scripture, and cultivation of a strong faith community.

Nursery

Childcare is available during Sunday worship for infants and toddlers ages newborn to twoyear-olds. Our nursery staff is trained and have passed background checks.

Family Worship

Typically held on the first Sunday of each month, Family Worship offers the opportunity to share scripture, message, and communion as a family! Children's Bibles, books, and age-appropriate activity bags are available.

Sunday School

Our students and teachers engage with scripture and activities with our in-house curriculum through Countryside's theology and faith practices. Sunday School is offered for students pre-K through 6th grade.


HOLIDAYS

Hanukkah December 2-10, 2018

Hanukkah (alternately spelled Chanukah), meaning "dedication" in Hebrew, refers to the joyous eight-day celebration during which Jews commemorate the victory of the Maccabees over the armies of Syria in 165 B.C.E. and the subsequent liberation and "rededication" of the Temple in Jerusalem. The modern home celebration of Hanukkah centers around the lighting of the hanukkiyah, a special menorah for Hanukkah; foods prepared in oil including latkes (potato pancakes) and sufganiyot (jelly doughnuts); and special songs and games.
