AGAPE


The AGAPE group has been a ministry of love and support for many decades, providing a warm and loving fellowship opportunity following memorial or funeral services.

Travel to Israel with Rev. Dr. Eric Elnes in 2019

Is a trip to Israel on your bucket list? If so, we have the trip for you. Rev. Dr. Eric Elnes is leading a trip to Israel and the Palestinian Territories November 3 through 16, 2019. This may be one of the most remarkable tours you will ever consider.

An ancient historian once wrote, "the land itself is the fifth gospel." He saw the impact of ancient trade routes and crossroads upon Bible literature; how the land itself influenced people's understanding of themselves, their relationship with others, and even their relationship with God.

Standing at breath-taking vistas, viewing ancient crossroads, walking ancient Bible paths that Jesus and the prophets knew provides an exciting step toward making the pieces of the Bible fit together. In Dr. Elnes's words, visiting this land "turns reading the Bible into a 3-D experience for the rest of your life."

Drawing on Dr. Elnes's profound biblical and historical knowledge (Ph.D. in Biblical Studies from Princeton Theological Seminary), as well as an in-country guide who is a legend among guides in Israel (Dr. Stephen Langfur), we will travel everywhere from the Dead Sea in the south to the town of Dan in the furthest north.

Along the way, we will focus on the center of Jesus's public ministry around the regions and shores of the Sea of Galilee. We will sail the sea on a double scale replica of a fishing boat found in our lifetime on the northern shore. In Jerusalem we will sit on the Temple Steps in the Ophel Ridge and reconsider the Kingdom Parables of Jesus in Luke 19-21. One prominent Jewish scholar insists this is the one place where we may say with certainty that Jesus actually was and where He taught parables. We will walk on the ancient Herodian pavement that was familiar to Jesus, adjacent to the Western Wall. All this and more! Staffing Plan for Art and Music Ministry

The Personnel Committee and the Board of Art and Music announces staffing plans to support current art and music ministries. The plan ensures current programming is staffed appropriately to continue as originally scheduled while enabling a thorough discernment period to evaluate our current situation, plan for the future, and provide a smooth transition into our new building. The plan has three phases: Stop-Gap, Interim Period, and Long-Term Solution. During the Stop-Gap period, which runs from November through January 2019, Alex Ritter will act as the Artistic Director providing artistic direction, program administration, and personnel management. The Chancel Choir and Spirit of Grace will be lead by Bruce Blanchard and Tyler Gruttemeyer respectively, and the Arts Affirmation Program will be administered by Will Howell.

Phase 2, the Interim Period, runs from February 2019 through March / April 2020. During this time, a team consisting of Moderators, Ministers, Staff and Board members will develop a staffing structure to support current and future needs. This is followed by recruitment of new hires and plan implementation. The Interim Period aligns with the relocation to the Tri-Faith Commons and the installation of our new Buzard Pipe Organ.

THE BOX FOR DECEMBER

The Box for DECEMBER will be Omaha's Indian Hills Elementary School. We are collecting warm hats, gloves, scarves, mittens and coats for the children. Indian Hills Elementary is the oldest public school building in Omaha. It continues to include some families of parents and grandparents who also attended the school. Indian Hill continues to serve a naturally integrated and diverse group of students. Of the approximately 650 students, 24% are African American, 64% are Hispanic, 8% are Caucasian, and 2% are Native American. Your help is needed to ensure these children will be warm and safe throughout Omaha's wintery months.

YOUR BOARD OF CHRISTIAN OUTREACH 2018 CHRISTMAS OFFERING

Your Board of Christian Outreach (BOCO) is pleased to share with you that Los Chavalitos is the recipient of the 2018 Christmas Offering. During this Christmas season, please help us continue our dedication to the members of the Los Chavalitos community and make a financial gift to support health and hope for families who rely on this clinic. Los Chavalitos provides life-saving measures, and they need our help.

Since its inception 26 years ago, Los Chavalitos has served thousands of patients, the majority of them residing in nearby poverty-ridden barrios (neighborhoods). The focus of the clinic has evolved into a strong community outreach, with an active casa base (base house) program and physician services offered in the clinic five days per week. The 18 female owners of the base houses are respected members and leaders of their communities. They receive ongoing training and support from Los Chavalitos in recognizing and treating early signs of diarrhea, pneumonia, dengue fever, and other common diseases. They are supplied with suero (oral rehydration salts), which can be dispensed with instructions to the caretakers of the dehydrated children.

Countryside's assistance is needed to ensure that Los Chavalitos can continue this programming and make a difference in their community. Donations can be made through special offering envelopes found in the pews on Sunday mornings, by mailing in your donation or by visiting countrysideucc.org/give for your online donations.

Christian Outreach embraces opportunities that reflect appreciation, respect, and love where there was otherwise much neglect - providing funding and service opportunities that nurture lasting change in our congregation, our community, and our world.



Hanukkah December 2-10, 2018

Hanukkah (alternately spelled Chanukah), meaning "dedication" in Hebrew, refers to the joyous eight-day celebration during which Jews commemorate the victory of the Maccabees over the armies of Syria in 165 B.C.E. and the subsequent liberation and "rededication" of the Temple in Jerusalem. The modern home celebration of Hanukkah centers around the lighting of the hanukkiyah, a special menorah for Hanukkah; foods prepared in oil including latkes (potato pancakes) and sufganiyot (jelly doughnuts); and special songs and games.

Hanukkah, a holiday primarily celebrated at home, begins on the 25th day of the Hebrew month of Kislev and is observed for eight days. In the Talmud, the rabbis taught that the mitzvah of Hanukkah, the commandment at the heart of the observance of the holiday, is a "candle for each man and his household." Hence, the actual mitzvah, or commandment, of Hanukkah is to kindle the Hanukkah lights in one's home. Blessings are recited over lighting the candles. One candle is lit for each night.
