#### Music Notes:

Our Call to Worship this morning is a musical one, Charles Gounod's *O Divine Redeemer*, and speaks to the fact that we are all outcasts in our own way, yet accepted by the radical acceptance and love of Christ. Written at the end of his life, born out of grief at the tragic passing of his grandson, he called it "Repentir" – which means repentance. The text is an emotional expression of a wide range of human feelings – longing for repentance, feeling abandoned, longing for mercy, feeling lost – and the hope we have in spite of these things, being invited to the Lord's table even so.

Ah! turn me not away, receive me, though unworthy, . . .

Gregory Porter's *Take Me to the Alley* tells the story of a king that would rather be taken away from public adulation and the luxuries of royalty to instead be brought to the outcasts, to the surprise of those who prepare for his arrival with by decorating their houses and rolling out the red carpet, so to speak. As Porter explains, "when I say take me to the alley, I mean in every city there might not be a physical alley. It may be just those forgotten places. Those dark places. Those neglected places that need to be elevated and illuminated in a way. That's a conversation maybe about poor people, minorities. It may be a conversation about people addicted to something. It might be about an area that receives less than the support that it should have. Whatever place needs to be elevated and lifted up in some kind of way and brought to a good standard: that's the alley."

Take me to the alley. Take me to the afflicted ones.

Take me to the lonely ones that somehow lost their way.

Let them hear me say, I am your friend.

Come to my table. Rest here in my garden. You will have a pardon.
