Music notes:

Eleanor Farjeon (1881-1965) was an English writer and suffragette who is best known in the US for her hymn "Morning Has Broken" (popularized by Yusuf Islam's recording). Her hymns are controversial! The Hymn Society of Great Britain has spoken against her hymns for not saying anything about original sin and claim that her texts are, "certainly not specifically Christian, echoing some sort of harmony with Judaism and Islam."

People Look East has the spirit of a Christmas carol, but features an imaginative Advent text that is particularly remarkable when viewed though a progressive theological framework. Imagery guides us "toward the star," with each verse depicting a different manifestation of "love:" first as a guest, then as "the rose," then as "the star," and finally as "the Lord." As one hymn scholar puts it, "Key images of the season are abundant. East is the direction of the rising sun and, in the history of Christianity, the coming Messiah.

In stanza two, the 'furrows' (or trenches dug in the ground) of bare earth are waiting for the seed that will flourish in the reign of the Promised One. In stanza three, the stars that guided the Magi shape the 'bowl' of the heavens, giving signs of hope beyond 'the frosty weather.' The angels' song, in stanza four, sets 'every peak and valley humming,' an oblique reference to Isaiah 40:4, 'Every valley shall be exalted and every mountain and hill brought low.'"
