Poetry Small Group

Music notes:

Catherine Winkworth was a nineteenth-century women's rights activist and education advocate. Her focus was German music, and she translated many hymns we sing to this day. Comfort, Comfort, Ye My People, a versification of Isaiah 40:1-5, was paired with a French renaissance tune by Louis Bourgeois, a composer with the distinction of being jailed for altering popular hymns in a manner not appreciated by the authorities.

Patapan is a 17th-century French Burgundian carol dating that uses onomatopoeic sounds to mimic flutes and drums. "Patapan" is meant to mimic the sound of the drum, and an accompanying lyric, "tu-re-lu-re-lu," represents the flute. This is a similar concept to the carol "The Little Drummer Boy", with its chorus of "pa-rum-pa-pum-pum."

Gaudete, which means Rejoice in Latin, is a late 16th-century Christmas carol, thought to have originated in Scandinavia. Being removed from the rest of Europe, Scandinavia was a bit behind the times culturally, and this carol is more characteristic of medieval music from the main continent but has had staying power since it was published in 1582.
