Music Notes:

Our entry into Lent is symbolized through the imposition of ashes in a sign of a cross and the phrase "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." The sentiment of that phrase has been shared by many religions and cultures throughout human history as a lens through which to interpret the meaning of life and how to live. *Dust In The Wind* by Kansas speaks to this compellingly, through an indigenous cultural paradigm that happens to be very similar to the Abrahamic paradigm.

In an interview, Kansas guitarist Kerry Livgren shared his inspiration for the song: "I was reading a book on American Indian poetry one day, and I came across that line... 'for all we are is dust in the wind,' and I thought, well, you know, that's really true. Here I got all this success – I've got material possessions – I've got a goal in my life that had been accomplished at that point, but I'm going back into the ground – and what does this really mean in light of that?"

Sylvia Dunstan was a United Church of Canada minister and prison chaplain who was known for her passion for those in need, her gift of writing, and her love of liturgy. She passed at a young age after a battle with liver cancer, but wrote a number of important hymns during her short career. *Transform Us As You, Transfigured* is based on today's scripture story and is an exhortation for Christ to guide us through our journey through Lent.
