Music notes:

April is National Jazz Month - an opportunity to celebrate the heritage and history of jazz. The Free Jazz movement emerged in the 50s and 60s around a highly improvisational form of music. It used music as a message - a rejection of systems and structures and challenging power for social change, informed by the civil rights movement and the fight against racism and inequality.

Eddie Harris's *Freedom Jazz Dance* is only one chord the entire song. While the melody is chromatic and takes the listener outside of the chord, what makes this piece interesting is each player's unique addition of dissonance (playing outside the chord) and tension underneath the surface of the music, navigating in and out of the harmony.
