

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Core 56

Our Core 56 groups welcomes all students in 5th and 6th grade to meet to discuss scripture stories that center primarily around the New testament and the teachings of Jesus. Each week, we will discuss scripture stories, consider historical and cultural context, and contemplate how we can use what we have learned from them in our lives today. Please ask your Core 56 student to bring their bible—if you don't have one, just ask Rebecca! At the beginning of each class, we will spend 3-5 minutes in a meditative prayer sit.

Holy Moly

Our students meet in two classrooms on the lower level in groups of K-2nd graders and 3rd and 4th graders. Each week this fall, we will explore an Old Testament tale with storytelling, a short video, and an activity. In October, we will cover the stories of Exodus, The Stone Tablets, Deborah, and Samuel.

Sunday School

We are very excited to study scripture stories with our Countryside children! During the 9am service, our students will meet together into two classrooms: pre-K and one large group for Kindergarten through 6th grade. During the 11AM service, our students are divided between four classrooms: Pre-K, K-1st, 2nd-4th, and 5th & 6th grades.

We leave together as a group after the Children's Moment and head to classrooms. Students remain in their classrooms until collected by a parent or guardian. Please remember our students and teachers in your prayers as they explore scripture stories together this semester!

Through story, discussion, and experiential activities, our students embark on a Christian path encouraged by enthusiastic study, adventurous approach to Scripture, and cultivation of a strong faith community.

Nursery

Childcare is available during Sunday worship for infants and toddlers ages newborn to twoyear-olds. Our nursery volunteers are trained and have passed background checks.

Vacation Bible School

Vacation Bible School is a short summer camp designed to immerse our students in a community experience of scripture stories and activities

Wednesday Night Programming - Holy Moly

During the school year, K through 4th grade students meet for Holy Moly! A Sparkhouse curriculum teaches Bible stories with multimedia, crafts, activities, and storytelling.

Wednesday Night Programming - Core 56

On Wednesday nights, our 5th and 6th grade group delves into scripture study of Jesus's ministry and work. We also fellowship at lockins, movie nights, and group suppers.

Sunday School

Our students and teachers engage with scripture and activities with our in-house curriculum through Countryside's theology and faith practices. Sunday School is offered for students pre-K through 6th grade.

Family Worship

Typically held on the first Sunday of each month, Family Worship offers the opportunity to share scripture, message, and communion as a family! Children's Bibles, books, and age-appropriate activity bags are available.

Children's Church

This child-centered Worship celebrates our faith stories with songs, scripture, and discussion while honoring faith practices like communion, prayer, and stewardship! It's open to children five years old through 6th grade.



MUSIC & ARTS MINISTRIES

Arts Affirmation

A Great Start for Arts Affirmation


Our new opportunity for budding artists is off to a great start!

LOOK AT THIS SMALL SERVICE GRANT (SSG)!

A non-profit organization called One Nation Walking Together (ONWT) has been building chicken coops on Native American Reservations. The locations are carefully selected for where nutrition is scarce and protein comes at a premium. Young hens are provided places along with several months of food and bedding. Countryside members Don Sarton and Ryan Palmer participated in the latest build following Don's request for an SSG to help pay for a portion of the construction materials. With guidance from ONWT over Labor Day weekend, they joined forces with a few folks from Don's former church, First Christian Church in Colorado Springs. This was the fifth and largest coop built by ONWT, and it will house 30 chickens. The forthcoming eggs (and fertilizer) provide fresh and valuable commodities to ANPO WICAHPI, an all-girls school with 24 students on the Pine Ridge Reservation.

UPCOMING HOLIDAYS

Muslim

Muharram is October 1 marks the start of the Islamic New Year and is a joyful day as Prophet Muhammad (pbuh) told us when Allah saved Moses from Pharaoh, so he requested a fast celebrating that victory.

Jewish

Sukkot is October 4-11. Sukkot, a Hebrew word meaning "booths" or "huts," refers to the Jewish festival of giving thanks for the fall harvest. Extending hospitality, especially to the needy is a Sukkot custom. Many Jews invite guests outside of their families to join them for a holiday meal in the sukkah (symbolizes the frail huts in which the Israelites lived during their 40 years of wandering in the desert).

Simchat Torah is October 12-13. Immediately following Sukkot, Jews celebrate Sh'mini Atzeret and Simchat Torah, a fun-filled day during which they celebrate the completion of the annual reading of the Torah and affirm Torah as one of the pillars on which they build their lives. As part of the celebration, the Torah scrolls are taken from the ark and carried or danced around the synagogue seven times.
