WE WILL CONTINUE TO MASK INTO 2022

We will still be wearing masks inside the church as the omicron variant makes its way through the U.S. The omicron variant is HIGHLY transmissible and multiplies much more quickly. The omicron variant has surpassed the delta variant in the U.S. within this past month (nearly 75% of cases). Even if it turns out that the disease from omicron is not more severe than delta, with the ability to quickly multiply and infect others, we will continue to overwhelm our hospitals.

Please vaccinate yourselves and your families when you are able to, and take precautions such as masking and social distancing when in public. Also, stay home when you are sick. Let's all pray together, for the health and safety of our healthcare workers, as they have been on the front lines of this pandemic for almost two years now.

Small Group

Beginning on Saturday, January 22, Pastor Tracey will be facilitating a six-week series on Bold Conversations on Race and Social Justice. MINDFUL MEDITATION SITS WITH CARLOS, WEDNESDAYS AT 6 PM



ABRAHAMIC RELIGIONS IN DIALOGUE COURSE: CRUSADES, HOLOCAUST, AND INTER-FAITH RELATIONS

RELI 1000-820 Abrahamic Religions in Dialogue - Crusades, Holocaust, and Interfaith Relations

This is the second course in a series of three on Abrahamic Religions in Dialogue.

Abrahamic Religions in Dialogue – Crusades, Holocaust, and Interfaith Relations is a one-credit hour course introducing the Crusades, the Holocaust, and their impact on relations between Jewish, Christian, and Muslim groups in the past and today in five sessions/modules. These modules will cover various topics, including how religious groups understand "holy war," 20th century anti-Semitism and religious change, and more positive interfaith models like al-Andalus.

Students will demonstrate their knowledge by identifying how historical conflict and catastrophe impact interreligious relations as well as self-understanding and identity.

This course has been designed, developed, and implemented in collaboration between faculty of UNO Religious Studies and staff of Tri-Faith Initiative.

The three areas they focus on are:

Resettlement: Meeting immediate needs of newcomers in their first 90 days: settling into their first home, establishing healthcare providers, enrollment in English classes, employment connections, and more.

Empowerment: Driving classes, financial literacy, access to higher education and job skill development, leadership and civic engagement opportunities.

Center: Expanding social support networks, creative space to share and celebrate home cultures, and the chance for former refugees to give back to their new communities.

On November 4, the al Ghates family, one of the Syrian families Countryside previously sponsored, was honored with the Milagro Award for 2021 from One World Community Health Centers. A beautiful video of the family was shown at the banquet. In it, Kholoud, the mother, talks about how different life in America is. The Milagro Award ("milagro" means miracle in Spanish) was given to the family for having a "passion for life, advocating for their children's health, and navigating an entirely new health care system with energy, dedication and commitment." The al Ghates family has six children, three with developmental needs. Four of the children are enrolled in the Millard School District, and the two older children attend Metro. Khalid, the father, earned his CDL and drives for a van company. The family bought a new home near our church about a year ago. They are an American refugee success story!
