### **TASK FORCE UPDATE**

Countryside Community Church COVID-19 Policy

At the March 22, 2022, Church Council Meeting, the Church Council moved to adopt as church policy the recommendation of the Reopening Task Force to follow the CDC Community Levels for Douglas County regarding masking. The following guidelines will be used for activities held at the church with the exception of children and youth activities, choirs, and upon the request of invited guests. Exception guidelines will be determined by the ministry staff and boards.

- Current Douglas County Risk Level: LOW (green)
  - Masks: Optional
- Current Douglas County Risk Level: MEDIUM (yellow)
  - Masks: Recommended/Requested
- Current Douglas County Risk Level: HIGH (orange)

### Masks: Required

At this time, children's and youth activities at Countryside Community Church, including Kindernook, will continue to mask through the end of the school/program year (May) and choirs will also continue to mask.

### Levels of CDC COVID Risk for Douglas County

### LOW RISK

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When the current Douglas County risk level is: LOW (green)

### Masks: Optional

### **MEDIUM RISK**

When the current Douglas County risk level is: MEDIUM (yellow)

Masks: Recommended/Requested

Maintain improved ventilation throughout indoor spaces when possible

If you have household or social contact with someone at high risk for severe disease:

- consider self-testing to detect infection before contact
- consider wearing a mask when indoors with them

### **HIGH RISK**

When the current Douglas County risk level is: HIGH (orange)

Masks: Required - wear a well-fitting mask indoors in public, regardless of vaccination status (including in K-12 schools and other indoor community settings)

Maintain improved ventilation throughout indoor spaces when possible

If you have household or social contact with someone at high risk for severe disease:

- consider self-testing to detect infection
  before contact
- consider wearing a mask when indoors with them

Individuals who are immunocompromised or at high risk for severe disease

- Please follow your physician's instructions if you are immunocompromised or at high risk for severe disease. For more information, see COVID-19 for people with certain medical conditions
- Wear a mask or respirator that provides you with greater protection

### **PASTORAL SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE**

Your Pastoral Search Committee (PSC) met twice in March as a large group. At our March 10th meeting we had a 90-minute conversation by Zoom with Rev. Sarah Jones, our UCC conference liaison. Rev. Jones provided the PSC members the UCC guidelines to follow for the search process and provided encouragement that there is a rich pool of interested clergy.

The PSC and a smaller work group is preparing a follow-up survey to the discernment process we engaged in this past fall. The discernment information was analyzed by several individuals with exceptional skills and by the entire PSC at their February retreat. Questions are being developed around three themes that will help us prioritize the traits we are seeking: What pastoral traits are important to me? (Self-Reflection) What pastoral traits are important in a settled minister for Countryside? (Leadership) What pastoral traits are important to the congregation as a whole? (Greater good of the Congregation) We are seeking the assistance of members of the congregation, and others, with survey research skills to help finalize the survey so it can be made available both electronically and on paper. More on this activity will be shared in the coming month in the C-10.

In late April a "Town Hall Forum" will be held to address additional topics that are important to the search but not as conducive to a survey format. The PSC believes that it is critical that varied input opportunities are provided to gather insights that may not be easily represented in a survey format. Your PSC is developing that meeting format and more information will be forthcoming in the C-10.

The congregation now has access an email address where you can directly send questions, comments, and concerns about the pastoral search for a settled minister. Correspondence will be answered in a timely manner. Send your communications to pastoralsearchcommittee@countrysideucc.org

### **INTERIM SEARCH COMMITTEE UPDATE**

The Interim Search Committee is diligently proceeding on a multi-track path. We have been updating the United Church of Christ (UCC) Church profile, which is a six part document describing both the requirements we have for an Intentional Interim Minister, but also provides applicants with comprehensive information about our church. While updating this information to reflect our current needs and our current status, we have also been networking. We have had several conversations with the NE-IA-SD UCC Associate Conference ministers (Sarah Jones and Ellis Arnold, who were in attendance at the annual meeting), as well as ministers who know our church, and those we know to be in the Interim Ministry profession. We are also in discussions with staff and congregational members to get input and feedback. We will be doing more sharing as we continue our progress.

The Church Profile has been posted to the UCC job board. Applicants will make their first contact throough the NE-IA-SD UCC Conferences office where the Search and Call team will do some initial vetting. Prospective candidates will then be forwarded to the Interim Hire Team for us to review materials. Eventually, we will select from the available pool of candidates to review more detailed information, such as recorded sermons, zoom interviews, and other selection screening tasks yet to be determined.

Our goal is to conduct this process with integrity consistent with our church's values, and guided by UCC input. We are available for questions and feedback.

### **BOARD OF CHRISTIAN OUTREACH AND TRI-FAITH**

### **EASTER OFFERING**

The Board of Christian Outreach (BOCO) has joined with Countryside's mental health designation group to support Completely Kids with our Easter Offering for 2022. After two years of living in a pandemic, whether we are aware of them or not, we have all encountered mental health challenges – through our own families, loved ones, or personally. We have changed how we live our lives to stay safe physically, but our emotional selves have suffered. To go forward, to return to a "new" normal, we must take steps to safeguard our physical and emotional health. Completely Kids is helping young people – ages 4-17 - create a brighter tomorrow through its mental health programs.

Located in downtown Omaha, Completely Kids has been helping kids since 2013. Completely Kids' mission is to break the cycle of poverty and help kids and their families overcome the barrier to success. Originally tackling child hunger through a weekend food program, Completely Kids has expanded its services to include after-school programs, teen employment program, family services and most recently a dedicated mental health program. The mental health services have expanded from 1 therapist 2 years ago to 4 full time and 2 part time therapists currently. The mental health services also include group skill-based training in conjunction with their 16 after school programs. The skill-based groups gather kids together to discuss different topics and provide training to help kids learn positive ways to cope with life's struggles. Skills are focused around building their abilities to self-regulate, identify and master emotions, reduce stress and express themselves in a health way. These groups are a great way for kids to learn from each other as much as from their teacher. Finally, Completely Kids also offers Mindful Movement & Technique classes that help the kids through the development of mindfulness skills that can be applied to any area of life. All of these programs work to tackle concerns before they become issues.

Our goal, as the Countryside community, is to make a positive difference. Through supporting Completely Kids, we will make that difference – by helping one child at a time to believe in hope. Lulu Rangel of Completely Kids, related a story of a 4th grader who, in 2020, had experienced COVID in a very personal way – the death of her father. The family had taken significant steps to stay healthy at the onset of COVID, so were struggling with the shock and grief of his unexpected death. Angelica experienced severe anxiety over the loss of her father and was fearful for the health of her mother. Her anxiety resulted in a dramatic shift in personality – she was no longer engaging in virtual programming and isolating herself. Angelica's anxiety continued to grow until it resulted in extreme panic when her mother would leave the house for work or just to get groceries. Through therapy, she started to share her feelings of loneliness and low self-worth. She has returned to school as a 5th grader but still struggles with her anxiety. Completely Kids has helped her identify the triggers and assisted her in building a strong support system and healthy coping skills. Angelica is now helping others by sharing her own journey about how she processed the grief – helping others to see hope.

BOCO asks for your help to say: "We see you. We know you may be hurting. We share your urgency." We ask for your support for the Countryside Easter Offering and Completely Kids mental health program. If you have any questions, please contact a BOCO board representative.

### **GUEST SPEAKER**

Rabbi Deana Sussman Berezin will be Countryside's guest speaker on Sunday, April 3. Rabbi Berezin is a native of St. Louis, Missouri. She served as the Rabbi Educator at Central Reform Congregation, a vibrant congregation of 780 households in the city of St. Louis. Rabbi Berezin attended HUC-JIR in Los Angeles. She earned a Master of Arts in Jewish Education and was ordained in May of 2014. In addition to student pulpits at Temple Beth Torah, Temple Beth Shalom, Beth Knesset Bamidbar, and at the China Lake Naval Air and Weapons Station, Rabbi Berezin served as the Harold M. Schulweis Rabbinic Intern at Jewish World Watch, an organization that promotes education, advocacy and action around issues of genocide and mass atrocities. She had a second rabbinic internship at Our House Grief Support Center, providing pastoral care to both children and adults. Prior to her enrollment in rabbinic school, Rabbi Berezin attended Indiana University, graduating Phi Beta Kappa with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Jewish Studies and Religious Studies and a double minor in Hebrew and Psychology. Rabbi Berezin married Jared Berezin in 2016.
