Our Windows

With the renovation of the Sanctuary in 2000 it was decided by the Building Committee, under the leadership of John S. McCollister, to commission local glass artists, Mark and Kristi Lambrecht, to create new rock glass windows. Extensive research was undertaken by the committee. It was decided that each window would have a theme using Christian symbolism to inspire the imagination, tell a story or cast light on an idea found in Scripture. Our stunning windows engage all ages in an aesthetic and learning adventure in theology and practice.






CORE 56

A BOARD OF CHRISTIAN OUTREACH (BOCO) MOMENT....

Countryside Community Church has been instrumental in the creation and development of four major outreach opportunities both in Omaha and abroad. The four agencies are Asian Rural Institute, our 2018 Easter Offering recipient, Together, Inc., and Countryside's Community Cupboard Food Pantry. This month, BOCO would like to introduce you to the Los Chavalitos Clinic in Managua, Nicaragua.

Los Chavalitos Clinic is the outreach of APUSAN, a Spanish acronym meaning "Association of Pediatricians United for the Health of the Children." APUSAN was founded by a small group of ambitious Nicaraguan medical residents in the early 1990s. The doctors, who saw a multitude of children with advanced stages of diarrhea, knew that diarrhea can be prevented and should not be a major cause of childhood death. Educating the parents was the key to prevention so they formed APUSAN, a legal corporation in Nicaragua. However, they had no funding to put their dreams of preventive measures into action. Through unpredictable, but fortuitous circumstances, a UNO social work professor on sabbatical in Nicaragua, learned of the aspirations of the APUSAN physicians and engaged her Rotary Club, back in Omaha, to support the mission of the Nicaraguan MDs. One of the Rotary members brought the cause to his church, Countryside Community Church. Subsequently, between the active support of the district Rotary Clubs and Countryside Community Church, a small structure in an impoverished Managua community was purchased and Los Chavalitos ("little kids") Clinic opened in 1994. From the beginning, and to this day, the front of the building has both the Rotary Club emblem on it and the words "Countryside Community Church" emblazoned on it. It is truly an Omaha product in the heart of this Nicaraguan capitol city, Managua. There is no government funding and the clinic provides primarily free care, with a small proportion of patients paying on a sliding scale. Private donations sustain the clinic on an ongoing basis.

Christian Outreach embraces opportunities that reflect appreciation, respect, and love where there was otherwise much neglect - providing funding and service opportunities that nurture lasting change in our congregation, our community, and our world.

The Box

...is where specific items are collected each month to address various needs. "The Suitcase" is where we continuously collect hotel-size toiletries. Both are in the Foyer near the front doors.

Community Cupboard

A large mobile food pantry takes place right here at Countryside on the first Saturday of each month from 9:00-11:30AM. You are invited to come witness this miracle happening!

Holiday Offerings (Christmas and Easter)

Each year the Board of Christian Outreach directs two special mission offerings—the Christmas and Easter offerings. These offerings are given to organizations both locally and internationally.

Small Service Grant (SSG)

Countryside members who volunteer with local groups/ events may apply for a small service grant (SSG) of less than \$500 to cover materials and supplies. Contact us or find the SSG request forms on the church website.

Tishah B'Av July 21-22




Eid Al Fitr June 15-June 17


