Who We Are:

We are an inclusive, open and affirming family of faith, welcoming all to God's table of love and acceptance.

We are diverse, yet united by Christ's example.

We care for one another, support one another and challenge one another to become all that God creates us to be.

We work together to nurture our community and to promote peace, equality and justice in our conflicted world.

Music notes:

Though Marty Haugen's *Gather Us In* is one of the most famous hymns in the Catholic Church in America, his actual affiliation is UCC. Haugen's poetry describes a community of hope, a community of honesty, a community of inclusiveness, and a community of caring. It invites us to recognize that the Kingdom of God is at hand here and now, not off in some distant future, and not "in some heaven, light years away." The work of the kingdom takes place now in the midst of the gathered, inclusive community.

It's not often that a hymn written over 100 years ago is more relevant to our world today than it was at its conception. *This is My Creator's World* was inspired by hymnist Maltbie Babcock's morning walks which he described as "going to see my Father's world." A lot of hymnody, especially American hymnody, contains themes of escapism – the notion that we should look forward to leaving this mess on earth to go home to heaven – which encourages "passive acceptance of the unacceptable present."

This hymn strikes a substantially different tone, emphasizing that the earth is our home and will always be and that we will not leave earth for heaven, but heaven and earth will be one. This creation theology – God's unwillingness to give up on creation – is particularly relevant to our time. The text also mentions "the music of the spheres," an ancient Greek philosophy that movements of the planets and the stars are a perfect form of music, inaudible to human ears (scientists did eventually confirm that there was some truth to this – for example, a distinct sound associated with the Big Bang). This dovetails with another theory of the physics of sound (one on display in the organ facade) – that every soundwave reverberates forever – another conception of creation's harmony.

Desafinado translates to "out of tune" or "off key." The music was written by Antônio Carlos Jobim in response to music critics who claimed that bossa nova was "a whole new genre for singers who couldn't sing." The lyrics, written later, draw a parallel between a perceived lack of harmony in music and discord in human relationships, but the genesis of the song itself serves as a reminder that the realities of human nature and perfectionist attitudes shouldn't deter us from living into our authentic selves - something particularly relevant to recognizing each of our unique contributions in ministering to one another.
