

Who We Are:

Music notes:

Pink Floyd's Money is sometimes misunderstood as a tribute song to money, but their intention was actually to highlight the bad things that money can bring, paraphrasing part of Paul's letter to Timothy. The original recording was notable for its use of a tape loop to use sound effects in sync with the music. A cash register sound took twenty feet of tape meticulously cut with razor blades and reassembled with splicing tape.

The Last Words of David, one of Randall Thompson's most famous works, sets text from Second Samuel to music with an extraordinary dramatic musical interpretation. It speaks to the kingdom of God and the leadership of God's people bringing forth new life 'just as the sun and rain call forth life from the earth.' These sentiments point to a messianic vision, ultimately to Christ, as no human ruler would measure up. That said, David's words do point to a model for us to follow in leadership and in life, and there is a direct through line from those words to this morning's scripture which points to gratitude and generosity in service to God's work in the world. Lest we think David exemplified any of this, it is worth noting these are the second to last words of David that appear in scripture. His actual last words on his deathbed are instructions for his son Solomon to kill an old and helpless enemy - more in line with his mobster style of rule.

The text of Be Thou My Vision dates from the 8th century, and the music originated in medieval Ireland. Irish nationalism is to thank for the prevalence of this hymn today. During the early 1900s, there was a movement to rediscover Irish contributions to world history and culture, and two scholars, Mary Byrne and Eleanor Hull translated the Old Irish poem into English and set the text to the tune SLANE. Ever since it has been one of the most popular hymns.
