

FALL FAITH STUDIES LECTURE SERIES

Center for Faith Studies Fall 2016 Lectures: Who Do You Say That I Am? Conversations With the Soul



“...on the way he asked his disciples, ‘Who do people say that I am?’ And they answered him, ‘John the Baptist; and others, Elijah; and still others, one of the prophets.’ He asked them, ‘But who do you say that I am?’” Mark 8:27-29

Matthew, Mark and Luke all tell this story of Jesus responding to the worry of his disciples by asking them to reflect on who they, the people closest to him, say he is. As we today journey in our faith, we are challenged to ask and answer that question. Who do we say that God is? Who does God say that we are? Who does God say the people I am called to be in relationship with are? James Fowler, widely known for his work on the psychology of religion and Stages of Faith.

It is a dialectical and evolving conversation. This season, the Center for Faith Studies invites us into this interactive understanding of faith so we can dialogue with the soul on this very powerful question.


### HIGHLIGHTS
