daily action. This gathering will meet monthly and is for all men - young, old, or in-between. THE BOX FOR MARCH

The BOX for March is St. Andrew's Lunch Program. St. Andrew's has been working with Siena Francis House for 18 years in conjunction with their program to provide food for the needy. Siena Francis House is the largest meal provider to the homeless in the state of Nebraska. In 2018, Siena Francis House provided 431,533 meals to more than 3500 individuals who were homeless at the shelter. The numbers continue to grow. The following meals comprise the shelter's meal program: breakfast, brunch on Sundays and all major holidays, midday lunch/sack lunches, and evening dinner. IN MEMORIAM

Christine Vivek's father Robert L. "Bob" Johnson, 85 years, died Wednesday, January 22, 2020. His funeral was February 1 at the United Presbyterian Church in North Bend, Nebraska.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

Did you know? The namesake of "Stephen Ministry" was Stephen, mentioned in Acts 6:5 as part of a group of men who were chosen to be deacons. Local churches were beginning to be established, and there arose some problems with Greek widows being neglected in their care. This neglect resulted in the apostles spending their time taking care of the widows at the expense of their ministry and their prayers. The apostles addressed this need by tasking the local church members to choose seven men who could be appointed to care for the widows. They were told to choose men who were full of faith and the Holy Spirit. Once the selection was completed, the newly chosen deacons were set before the apostles who laid their hands on them and prayed over them. The result of these deacons being ordained to care for the widows was the Word of God increasing, as the apostles had more time available for their ministry work.

MARCH SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSONS

March 8: Touching the Hem of Jesus—A woman who had been ill for twelve long and isolated years risked breaking social convention to touch Jesus; upon touching the hem of his cloak she was healed. Jesus is said to declare, “Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace.”

March 15: Beatitudes and the Sermon on the Mount—Jesus connected to the people around him and understood their hardships and pain. In his Sermon on the Mount, he both assured them of God’s presence and invited them to live more fully their relationship to God.

March 22: The Samaritan Woman at the Well: In the mystical and symbolic book of John, Jesus, a Jew, defies a social custom and asks a Samaritan woman for a drink from the well. In turn, Jesus promises her “living water,” which we understand as spiritual insight and relationship with God. Her joy became testimony to Jesus as Messiah.

MORE THAN A JOKE - FINAL SERIES IN MARCH, TEMPLE ISRAEL

More than a joke concludes in March with its final series, Let it Grow: Jewish, Christian & Muslim Perspectives on the Environment


