

#### Music notes:

Our music this morning contemplates leadership, mentorship, and the question of who has shaped our faith, with both gratitude for their example and a call to action to follow in their lead as we have opportunities to do so. Natalie Merchant's *Kind and Generous* has exactly this message. Her 1998 hit is, as one music critic puts it, "an uncluttered song of joy." For Merchant, the message is as much about being kind and generous to others as it is about being grateful for those who have been kind and generous to us.

"Pain throws your heart to the ground. Love turns the whole thing around. No, it won't all go the way it should, but I know the heart of life is good."

This sentiment expressed in the chorus of John Mayer's *The Heart of Life* is one that is instructive. The moments and people in our lives that shape our faith can show up in difficult times – in support and guidance during hopelessness, in pastoral care, and in processing grief.

As Paul Simon wrote *Bridge Over Troubled Water*, his original conception of it as a simple gospel-inspired hymn with two verses grew into something more dramatic – a challenge to the listener to provide comfort to those in need. As he puts it "I have no idea where it came from. It was one of the most shocking moments in my songwriting career. I remember thinking, 'this is considerably better than what I usually write.'"

It is worth noting that Simon was listening to a lot of music from the gospel group The Swan Silvertones at the time. Their song "Oh Mary, Don't You Weep" contained the line "bridge over deep water," which influenced Simon's writing. The phrase "troubled water" in this case can be interpreted as a difficult situation, but in most gospel music, troubled water refers to God stirring up the water at the pool at Bethesda, giving it healing power, hence the line "God's gonna trouble the water" from *Wade in the Water*.
