### Music notes:

In Christ There is no East or West is a radical hymn, in ways that weren't necessarily evident upon its writing, which happily prevented it from being cast aside and lost. It takes its opening idea from Rudyard Kipling's famous lines, "Oh, East is East, and West is West, and never the twain shall meet," and is a strong refutation of the triumphalism and hegemonic imperialism of of the era. While it does retain some vestiges of missionary exclusivism, we can reclaim that notion as "in Christ's teachings, there is no east or west." The text is set to a tune by Harry T. Burleigh, a fundamentally important figure in the development of characteristically American music. Burleigh compiled and arranged many historic African American spirituals and work songs, and codified them into the classical music cannon by introducing them in academia where they became popular staples in vocal repertoire.
