The Wheat cross-stitched quilt gracing the altar November 19 through 26 is a piece of Countryside's history and has been in Chris Gilmore's keeping since she became a member. The quilt was created in America's Bicentennial year, 1976, at the old church. The printed cloth was set up on a frame, and the women of Countryside dropped in when they could and cross-stitched the pattern. They completed two quilts (one was multi-colored and the other a monochrome), which were sent to a woman in Beatrice to be hand-quilted with the Bicentennial pattern.

Both quilts were created for a raffle. Unfortunately, people only bought tickets for the multipatterned design. Like the proverbial Charlie Brown, the monochrome quilt was left out of playing. But Countrysider Shirley Gilmore recognized the beauty and value of the neglected quilt; she knew how many hours and how much love went into its making. She bought the quilt and gifted it to Chris, who has always considered herself the Keeper of the Countryside Quilt and its history.
