## MUSICAL REFLECTION

*Be Still*

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him, and he was by the sea. Then one of the leaders of the synagogue, named Jairus, came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him repeatedly, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well and live." So he went with him.

And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. Now there was a woman who had been suffering from a flow of blood for twelve years. She had endured much under many physicians and had spent all that she had, and she was no better but rather grew worse. She had heard about Jesus and came up behind him in the crowd and touched his cloak, for she said, "If I but touch his cloak, I will be made well." Immediately her flow of blood stopped, and she felt in her body that she was healed of her disease. ## Music Notes

The prelude today is Bach's setting of the chorale version of Psalm 130. To convey the gravity of the text, Bach ensured the organist would have to suffer a bit to play the piece, which is notable for using six voices in counterpoint. This means there are two voices in the pedal, so both feet are playing independent melodies simultaneously, making it quite tricky.

"It Is Well With My Soul" was written in 1873 by Horatio Spafford after a series of traumatic events in his life. In 1871, his four-year-old son passed away, and the Great Chicago Fire caused him financial disaster. In 1873, after suffering further from the economic downturn, he made arrangements to travel with his family to Europe. After a business dispute caused him to be delayed, his family set sail ahead of him on the SS Ville du Havre. While crossing the Atlantic, a collision with another vessel caused the ship to sink. All four of Spafford's daughters died. His wife, Anna, survived and sent a telegram upon arriving in Wales: "Saved alone..."

Spafford was inspired to write the text as he sailed to join his wife and his ship approached the area of the accident. Understanding the context is important to engaging with the text – the steadfast nature of a river, the ups and downs of waves on the open sea, storm clouds giving way to light. Another note of interest about Spafford: he eventually moved to Jerusalem, where he and his wife established the American Colony, a Christian utopian society engaged in philanthropic activities among Jews, Muslims, and Christians. After decades of benevolent activities, the Colony ceased to be a communal society in the 1950s, becoming the American Colony Hotel, which hosted talks between Palestine and Israel that led to the 1983 Oslo Peace Accords.
