And every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. 


Our Church by the Numbers

We are just over three fourths of our church's fiscal year. Thus far, member revenue year-to-date is slightly above budget and expenses are slightly below our forecast. However, having noted that, the current year budget had a \$315,116 shortfall, when comparing this year's revenue and expense. We are using money from our savings account to make up the difference!
