

Invitation to the Table

One: God be with you.

Many: And also with you.

One: Lift up your hearts.

Many: We lift them up to God.

One: Let us give thanks to God.

Many: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

One: In the rich dark of winter, God makes an astounding promise: "I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up." (Jeremiah 33:15)

In the wilderness, a voice cries out, longing for

the Refiner's fire, repair, and renewal,
the promised birth (and rebirth) of hope.
Called to bear the weight and fruit of promise,
Mary sings ancient trust—the song of generations—
that God comes to fill the hungry and lift the humble.

We remember that, on the night before he was handed over to die,

Jesus broke bread with his friends, blessed it, gave thanks, and said, "Take, eat. This is my body, which I give for you. When you share it, remember me."
