

FIRST LESSON: Psalm 19

Antiracist Covenant

Countryside Community Church pledges to continue the ongoing work of antiracism. We, collectively and individually, commit to actively understand, identify, and dismantle racism, including in ourselves, both conscious and unconscious. We are inspired by the example of Jesus, grounded by the Holy Spirit, to be engaged in self-reflection, grow in awareness of systems of power and oppression, and challenge the status quo of white privilege and systemic racism so that all may experience love, safety, belonging, dignity, and equity.

We ACKNOWLEDGE:

- our lack of awareness regarding the complicity of the Christian Church's historic role in supporting and profiting from the subjugation and genocide of enslaved peoples, indigenous peoples, and all other marginalized groups.
- the effects of white supremacy, white exceptionalism, and white privilege present in the Church and community that have condoned people being treated as less than, inferior, or unworthy rather than as beloved children of God, made in the image of the Divine.
- we have participated in the normalization of unjust systems including healthcare, justice, policing, housing, and education.
- Nebraska's segregated communities have facilitated our complicity and allowed for systemic racism to continue.

We promise to TRANSFORM our hearts and minds by:

- not being silent or complicit but rather having the moral courage to publicly stand with people of color, the marginalized, and the oppressed.
- re-examining and deepening our understanding of systemic racism and its lasting damage to others and ourselves.
- engaging ourselves and our communities in critical discourse that propels us forward.

We commit to the following ACTION:

- Devise and implement standards, policies and programs that make our commitment to diversity and inclusion a visible reality.
- Stand up and speak out against everyday micro and macro acts of oppression, aggression, bigotry, and hate speech in all aspects of our common life.
- Educate ourselves and share with others the many places where our privilege blinds us and prevents us from showing compassion to others.
- Collaborate with community organizations to promote equity for all people.
