
A Sacred Journey

Walking Through Lent & Easter at Countryside

Lent is a season of reflection, renewal, and preparation—a time when we pause to realign our hearts with God's love and grace. Rooted in the 40 days Jesus spent in the wilderness, Lent invites us into a deeper awareness of our faith, leading us toward the transformative joy of Easter.

At its core, Lent is about making space: space to reflect, to let go, to open ourselves to God's presence in new ways. Some engage in fasting or giving something up, while others take on new spiritual practices—whether through prayer, study, acts of service, or simply being more present to the sacred in daily life. Whatever your practice, Lent offers an invitation to journey intentionally toward the hope of resurrection.

One of the unique ways we embrace this journey at Countryside is through Taizé worship—a simple, meditative form of Christian worship centered on prayerful chanting, scripture, and silence. Originating from the Taizé Community in France, this practice is designed to foster reconciliation and peace, creating a sacred space where we can quiet our hearts and rest in God's presence. Through repetitive, meditative chants, we are invited into a deep and prayerful stillness, where words fade and the soul speaks.

designated Restoring Dignity as the recipient of this month's Box donations, offering us a tangible way to help meet the needs of refugee families as they build new lives.

At the heart of Restoring Dignity is the belief that something can—and should—be done to ensure refugee families have safe, stable, and dignified homes. The organization's core services provide help with resettling, education, and advocacy.

Countryside can support this important work by donating essential household items for Restoring Dignity's in-home education classes. Requested items include bathroom and kitchen cleaning products; batteries (all sizes); basic tools (hammer, screwdrivers, pliers); and assorted nails and screws.

Join Don Sarton for a 6-week journey through Paul's Letter to the Romans in this bring-your-own-lunch Soup, Salad, and Scriptures, series. Explore why Paul wrote to the early Christian community in Rome, how he wrestled with his Jewish identity and commitment to the Torah, and how he sought to understand the revelation of Jesus Christ and the New Covenant.

Romans, though the last of Paul's epistles chronologically, is placed first in the biblical canon—likely due to its length and significance. While it may not be a full summation of Paul's Christology, it offers deep insight into his theological struggles and evolving thought.



What's in a Theme? (...and logo and stuff!)

This year's Lenten theme, everything [in] between, is reflected in a powerful graphic that speaks to the tension and possibility found in the spaces between us.

At the heart of the design, two hands reach toward each other—paused just before they connect. They represent our longing for relationship, even amid the politics, assumptions, beliefs, and narratives that divide us. The space between them forms a doorway, symbolizing hospitality and a pathway forward. It invites us to look for God in the inbetween places, where the sacred so often dwells.

The typography reinforces this message. The brackets around [in] draw attention to God's presence in the unexpected, the surprising, the overlooked. Brackets, used grammatically to add explanation, remind us of our call to explore complexity, ask questions, and remain open to where God might meet us on the journey. Even in the tension, even in the waiting—God is there.
